I have offered plants and seeds grown in my yard throughout the years. About twenty Palmer residents have enjoyed these at no cost.

My style of gardening is in the soil or planters. For those that choose either method, I recommend the Palmer Yard Waste Facility for composted leaf mulch which you can mix with your yard soil. Five inches mixed is a good starting point. If you have not been

to "the compost pile" drive south on Berks Street till the end, entering any 600 number in your GPS will get you there. Also available are ground wood chips which is good for preventing weed growth and both are free for the taking. For a fee, you can dispose of yard debris.

Let's Keep Palmer Township both Beautiful and Safe!

Due to the recent Pandemic, usage of our Township's Two Rivers and D&L Trail systems has increased remarkedly. This increased usage has expanded to our parks, waterways and all recreational venues. Bike usage on our trails and roads has increased. Palmer Township has installed new cross walk flashing lights at Greenwood Avenue adjacent to the post office, as well as several new trail barricades as a reminder to trail users to stop and look before crossing and to walk bikes across the roadway. Remember, the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code applies to motorist and bike riders alike, both are classified as vehicles. Use courtesy, intellect and common sense when nearing walkers and bike riders. All bike riders are reminded that dogs have a tendency to dart across the trail to reach that new smell, so as you approach a dog walker slow down, announce that you are approaching, this is for YOUR SAFETY as well as that of the dog and its owner!

As residents of Palmer Township each of us have moved here for either a specific or multitude of reasons. Palmer Township's Police Department has 38 members and has a robust Community Policing Program. The Fire Department has 45 members and operates an extensive array of equipment out of 2 stations. We are fortunate to have Suburban Emergency Medical Services provide a full spectrum of medical transportation to our three local hospitals, St. Luke's Easton and its Anderson Campus and the Lehigh Valley Health Networks' new Hecktown Oaks facility.

Keeping Palmer Township Beautiful is supported by Business, Industrial and Professional Association of Palmer Township (BIP) via funding the "Please do not litter, Thank you for your patronage" stickers that you are starting to see on exit doors of local businesses. Another entity that is performing services is the Palmer Park Mall. Its maintenance staff, on a daily basis, clears all litter from its parking lot and thus saves their neighbors from having to deal with other's trash. In an effort to ensure that our



roadways are not covered in litter Palmer Shammy Shine car wash provides Litter Bags to their customers. More and more businesses have placed trash cans outside of their buildings so customers can properly dispose of any unwanted materials.

We have seen a flurry of individuals and groups clearing litter from our Township's roads and trails. Community volunteerism is on an increase. It is very obvious that Township residents take great pride in their properties and take it a step further via assisting those who are either physically or financially incapable of maintaining the appearance of their property. Local church groups have been assisting parishioners maintaining the upkeep of their properties as well as the appearance of their neighborhoods.


Event representative must have permit with them for duration of the event.


- Penn Pump There are two permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm
 - **1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit** *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access.



Caregivers of Northampton County can get additional support through the Caregiver Support Program

Contact Northampton County Area Agency on Aging at 610-829-4540 for more information

- Caregivers can receive reimbursement for approved, out-of-pocket caregiving expenses such as respite care, assistance with personal care and consumable supplies such as adult disposable depends and nutritional drink supplements.
- Care receiver is age 60 or older and requires assistance with bathing dressing etc., or under age 60 with a diagnosis of dementia
- Reimbursement is based on the household income of the care receiver

 Assistance for Grandparents who are 55+ and are the primary caregiver for their grandchildren

> Assistance for older adults who are 55+ and are the primary caregiver for their adult children age 18-59 with a diagnosis of a non-dementia related disability.



The increasing amount of waste in our waterways is a problem caused by stormwater pollution. This form of pollution is known for rainwater and melting snow carrying loose trash and chemicals from roadways, parking lots and yards directly into rivers and streams. Common sources of stormwater pollution that can be addressed locally are pet waste, motor oil and other fluids leaking from vehicles, de-icing salt, debris like trash and dirt on roadways, as well as pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers. An impervious surface is anything that prevents water from soaking into the ground meaning the larger a parking lot is, the larger the impervious surface and greater the amount of stormwater runoff there will be.

Stormwater runoff and pollution are more likely to cause storm sewer overflow and human and wildlife health problems. In addition to these issues, when fertilizers are washed into rivers and streams an algal bloom can occur. When this happens, the algae that grows on the water surface uses all of the resources including dissolved oxygen that the fish need to survive. The algae also takes oxygen out of the water as it decomposes, creating a less habitable environment for fish and other organisms.



Local municipalities are taking action against stormwater pollution through the continued implementation of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Management Program. The program as mandated by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection addresses sources of stormwater pollution and seeks to unite the community around reducing pollution as a whole in our local area. The MS4 plan is meant to address issues like local flooding and algal blooms to improve water quality and quality of life for those in Palmer Township, as well as in the surrounding communities.

You can help by making sure you follow some good housekeeping practices to do your part like always picking up pet waste and properly disposing of it, not applying fertilizer to your lawn before it rains, and making sure that all household trash is in a bag and not loose in the tote or receptacle. To help do your part you can also keep up with your vehicle maintenance to assure that nothing will leak onto the road while driving or parked. You can also install rain barrels, rain gardens or reduce impervious surfaces outside of your home to reduce your stormwater runoff. Window flower boxes are a good choice because they can catch water from the roof and reduce runoff during a rainstorm. Rain barrels can also be used to store water for around the home use like watering plants or washing your car to save on utility bills.

To help encourage support behind the MS4 program and educate residents about our waterways, Palmer Township is looking for volunteers with help attaching medallions to local storm inlets that provide information on where the water drains to. Palmer Township also encourages any other suggestions or ideas on how residents and officials can improve pollution control and continue to advance the MS4 program. If you would like more information on the issue and possible at home solutions, please refer to the "Homeowner's Stormwater Handbook Smart Stormwater Management: A How-to for Homeowners" from Philadelphia Water Department and Delaware Estuary.







Dear Residents of Palmer,

After more than thirty-two years in law enforcement, twenty-two as Chief of Police, the time for me to retire has come. I will retire this month after a career in one of the most rewarding professions one can serve in. It has been my pleasure, privilege, and honor to serve the residents of both the City of Easton and Palmer Township during my time in law enforcement.

The department has maintained its accredited status with the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association Law Enforcement Accreditation Program after a third assessment in 2020, one of only 131 agencies out of approximately 1100 police agencies in Pennsylvania to do so. Serious crime (Homicides, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Theft, & Arson) from 2010 through 2019 has steadily decreased by 44 percent. Other crimes over the same period steadily decreased by 58 percent. 2020 crimes are not included due to the pandemic during which crime rates were abnormally low in numbers and would skew the data.

The department will be led into the future in the capable hands of a 30-year veteran of the Palmer Township Police Department who will introduce himself within this newsletter. I have been truly blessed to work with an incredible, hardworking, and fearless group of police officers and staff in both police departments during my career. Recently, they stared down the COVID virus and maintained vigilance over our community without hesitation or trepidation, continuing to perform their duties in an exemplary manner. Thank you for your support and cooperation during this difficult period in our history and for allowing me to serve as your Chief of Police for the past nine plus years.







Fire Zones

HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS

There will no collections on Labor Day or Thanksgiving Day and collections will be delayed by one day following these holidays.

CURBSIDE TRASH

- All trash goes into your green cart with the green lid. Materials outside the cart will not be collected.
- Trash should be bagged before being placed in the cart. Bagging helps keep your cart clean and reduces windblown litter.
- **Prohibited items include** recyclables (*see article to the right*), tires, hazardous waste, liquid paint, electronics, yard waste, construction debris, dirt, rock, and car parts.

Overfilled carts or carts containing prohibited items will not be collected.

RECYCLING DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Hartley Avenue Recycling Center Monday, Wednesday, Friday: 8:00am-4:00pm Saturday: 10am-3pm Sunday: 12pm-4pm

Accepts paper, cardboard, plastic bottles and containers, glass, cans, scrap metals, and yard waste (no more than three (3) small bundles of yard waste per visit.

Berks Street Yard Waste Composting Center

Accepts large amounts of yard waste for a small fee. NO plastic rope, bags, or twine. Unacceptable items include grass clippings, tree stumps, soil, sod, animal excrement, noxious weeds, bamboo, wood, or tree limbs over twelve (12) inches in diameter, or items contaminated with hazardous substances.

For the safety of the attendants, residents, and township employees, the speed limit of 5 MPH must be adhered to from the time you enter the center gate until you leave.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

All carts should be placed curbside by 5:00am.

PAPER – office and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, wrapping paper (no metallic paper or bows.) Shredded paper should be bagged and placed in the trash cart.

CARDBOARD – paper towel rolls, cereal, cracker, and pasta boxes, shipping and shoe boxes, manila folders, etc. No wax-coated, pizza or other food, paint or oil contaminated boxes. Flatten and/or cut up to release from the cart easily.

PLASTIC BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS – Rinsed household containers and bottles (such as soda, water, milk, juice, shampoo, detergent, condiments, yogurt, margarine, to-go containers, pet food, etc.) No Styrofoam. Look for the recycling triangle on the bottom with these numbers inside #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, and #7. Lids attached.

NEW!! FLEXIBLE (NOT RIGID) PLASTICS – these are <u>able to flex or wrap and are rinsed clean of food contamination</u>. Acceptable items include, plastic shopping bags, potato, chocolate chip and snack bags, produce bags including salad, grapes, and carrot bags, shredded cheese packages, pet treat pouches, case wrap, shrink film, bread bags, bubble wrap, cereal bags, drink and juice pouches, paper towel and toilet paper overwraps, detergent pouches, shipping bags. **GLASS** - Rinsed clear, brown, and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

CANS – Rinsed aluminum, bi-metal, and tin cans as well as empty aerosol cans. Metal pots and pans.

CARTONS – Rinsed food cartons that contain milk, juice, broth, cream, egg substitutes, soup, soy milk, and wine boxes.

No food contaminated items, electronics, textiles, construction debris, or yard waste.

UPCOMING SPECIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS

Place items curbside on your scheduled collection day during the weeks noted below.

They will be collected that week by a separate vehicle.

Bulk Item Collections - Weeks of September 13 and November 29

One bulk item can be placed curbside for each collection. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the curbside trash cart and include, but are not limited to furniture, tables, chairs, sofas, mattresses, rolled up and tied area rugs (no larger than 2' x 5'), etc. No hazardous waste, electronics, construction debris, yard waste, or additional household trash is acceptable as part of this collection.

Additional items can be placed curbside for collection during this week, *only if previously arranged and paid for by calling Waste Management at 800-621-2100 ahead of time.* Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township to get the reduced price of \$40 per item. Be sure to get a confirmation number.

Metal and Appliances Collection - Week of September 27

Includes all major appliances, such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, (Freon no longer needs to be removed) stoves, dishwashers (metal only, not plastic), hot water tanks, and trash compactors, BBQ grills and push-behind lawnmowers (gas, charcoal, oil removed), bicycles, swing sets if taken apart and bundled (no larger than 2' x 5") and other items of similar weight, material, size.

Remember, when you purchase new appliances, the stores where you purchase these types of items will typically take your old items.

Yard Waste Collection - Week of November 8

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, and garden clippings) will be collected curbside. Place your yard waste in any clean, open-top container (not in your automated carts), or tie in bundles no larger than 3' x 3'x 3" with cotton or hemp twine, or place in compostable paper bags. No plastic rope, plastic twine, or plastic bags and bundles or containers should be no heavier than 40 lbs.

Unacceptable items include grass clippings, tree stumps, soil, sod, animal excrement, noxious weeds, bamboo, wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, or items contaminated with hazardous substances.

Leaf Collection – Eight weeks in the Fall

Residents must rake their leaves into the street and close to the curb. This collection is highly dependent on weather conditions.

Christmas Tree Collection – First three (3) full weeks in January

Remove any transport bags, tinsel, ornaments, lights, and tree stands.






