#### **Make Your Holiday Season Red and Greener!**

The holiday season creates more trash and recycling than any other time of the year. As we prepare for the coming holidays, remember...rethink, reduce, reuse, and recycle!

Here's some green ideas:

- Wrapping paper is recyclable unless it is metallic. Bows and decorations are not recyclable.
- Get creative with wrapping and try using bandanas, cloth shopping bags, comic pages from newspaper which all work great!
- Use Christmas and holiday cards as ornaments, or for crafts and gift tags.
- Before the holidays, clean out and donate toys, clothing, games, etc.
- Replace old high-energy-use tree lights with energy efficient LED lights which saves energy and money.
- Buy a live holiday tree and plant it after the holiday.
- Put your cut tree out for collection curbside during the first 3 weeks of January. No tinsel, flocking, ornaments, other decorations, or plastic bags. The tree will be ground up and turned into compost or mulch.
- Reuse your "packing peanuts" and similar packing materials, or recycle them by taking them to one of your local package shipping stores.
- Extra holiday cardboard, gift boxes, and recyclables can be taken to the Palmer Recycling Center, at 3600 Hartley Ave. Their hours of operation are Mon, Wed, Fri, 12-4pm; Sat, 10-3pm; Sun 12-4pm

#### Here's What Goes into Your Recycling Cart with the Yellow Lid

Plastics – rinsed #1 through #7, no polystyrene foam. Attach lids.

Glass - rinsed clear, brown and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

**Metals** – rinsed aluminum, tin and steel cans, and household metals, pots and pans.

**Paper** – office, colored, and school paper, newsprint, junk mail, paper bags, phone books, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, wrapping paper (no metallic or bows).

Cardboard - shoe, gift, and cereal boxes, corrugated boxes, cut or flattened as needed

**Food and beverage cartons** – milk, cream, egg substitutes, orange juice, soup, broth, and wine cartons, and juice boxes

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FOOD CONTAMINATED ITEMS

Today's Palmer

For the first time in three years, we got significant amounts of rain during the summer months. Plants that were transplanted from member properties and seeds that were sown flourished. The picture shows ornamental grasses, hibiscus, and cleomes that are new this year at the west end of the Fairview Park bike path garden. Considerable time was invested at the two Palmer Post Office gardens. Besides weeding and watering, ten day lilies were added. Tentative plans for 2018 include sowing more hibiscus and cleome seeds and adding some butterfly bushes and daffodil bulbs.



#### PALMER PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

It is the Parks & Recreation Department's goal to provide citizens with a safe environment in which recreational opportunity can be maximized. Due to the wide variety of patron needs and use of Township property, it is necessary to establish the following rules and regulations.

#### Event representative must have permit with them for duration of the event.

**Reservations:** Will be available to Palmer residents only for the month of January, beginning on January 2nd, 2018 at 9:00 am. Park rentals will become available to the general public February 1st, 2018 at 9:00 am. All reservations must be completed in person at the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township, Located at 4100 Green Pond Road Palmer, PA 18045 Ph. 610-252-2098

#### Fees:

- Penn Pump- There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00AM-10PM
  - Penn Pump Pavilion Permit \*Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access.
     Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
  - 2. <u>Penn Pump Picnic Permit</u> \*Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people. Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion.
    - Residents \$50 & Non-Residents \$100
- $\bullet$  Riverview Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time  $8AM{-}10{:}00PM$ 
  - Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8AM– 10PM Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00
  - \*Note that Briarcliffe will not be available for rent on Weekends and Holidays from Memorial Day Labor Day.











#### **Clearance of Snow from Public Sidewalks**

Please remember that all snow, ice or sleet shall be removed from public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the same has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections. Whenever it may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet or ice, which may have become compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

#### Placement of Snow in the Roadway Prohibited

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is

not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

§109-3(SS) - Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.

#### When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township requires permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:

- Any structural change/alteration
- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- Re-roofing
- Replacement windows
- Replacement siding
- Decks
- Pools (permanent/temporary and replacement)
- Finished basements
- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners

- Additional living space conversions
- Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)



Building code regulations require minimum standards for design and construction to ensure the safety and welfare of the occupants. The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit Department at (610) 253-7191 for more information.



This is not an insurance policy. We also offer reduced rates for medically necessary non-emergency transportation services for both wheelchair and ambulance.

The BIP held their second quarter business luncheon on June 28, 2017. We welcomed back Jack Pfunder, CEO of the Manufactures Resource Center as our guest speaker. Jack's focus at this meeting was to discuss the importance of focusing on our middle school students to get them interest in STEM and the manufacturing sector as a possible future place of employment. As part of MRC's awareness program they are working with manufacturing industries such as BIP member Orbel Corporation in allowing middle school students to produce a video of the business in the "What is Cool about Manufacturing" series. There were 31 manufactures in the Lehigh Valley that participated in this program. Jack feels the programs are beginning to work. The Lehigh Valley Vo-Tech STEM program has grown from 254 students to 410.

At Bethlehem Vo-Tech the machinist program has grown from 3 to 35. He sees CIT increasing in STEM in the near future. Jack has a very real concern that those skilled workers who have a lot of experience in the current retirement generation will not have the younger worker coming up to replace them. He indicated that the manufacturing sector is growing at a rate of 20%, but the skilled workforce is only growing at 8%. Jack feels that without a skilled workforce in the Lehigh Valley, manufacturing will leave and new prospects will bypass the Lehigh Valley to settle elsewhere.






