*Pavilion rentals are prohibited during Palmer Community Days. Fees:

- **Penn Pump** There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00AM-10PM
 - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access.
 - Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
 - 2. <u>Penn Pump Picnic Permit</u> *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people. Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. Palmer Residents \$50.00 & Non-Residents \$100.00
- \bullet Riverview - Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8AM--10:00PM
 - Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8AM – 10PM
 - Palmer Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00
 - *Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends and holidays.*

Most Common Contaminants

Keep these common contaminants OUT of your recycling bin.



NO Recyclables in Plastic Bags

Empty loose recyclables in bin but leave the plastic bag out.



NO Food & liquids

Compost instead! Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Electronics & Small Appliances

Donate if in good condition, or schedule a bulky item pickup, if available. Check **earth911.com** for a local drop off site.



NO Textiles, Bedding, Rugs & Carpet

Donate these items if they are in good condition. Large quantities may require special disposal.



NO Hoses, Holiday Lights, Hangers & Extension Cords

They wrap around equipment and can shut down an entire facility! They all go in the trash.



NO Plastic Bags, Film/ Sheeting & Flexible Film Packaging

Take plastic bags back to a local grocer to keep bags clean and dry, and prevent them from shutting down recycling facilities. Visit plasticfilmrecycling.org to find a drop off location near you.



NO Paper Napkins, Plates, Cups & Tissues

Compost if possible, and remember to recycle the cardboard tube.



NO Polystyrene Foam

Foam and plastic to-go containers are not recyclable curbside. Find drop off programs for items like foam packing peanuts at earth911.com.



NO Tires, Auto Parts & Scrap Metal

(Not in recycling or trash) Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. Contact local scrap recyclers or retail tire stores for recycling options, or check earth911.com for a drop off center near you.



NO Concrete, Wood & Construction Debris

Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. You may be able to schedule a bulky item pickup – otherwise throw it in the trash or order a roll off bin by contacting Waste Management Customer Service.



NO Yard Waste & Wood

Compost or put in your yard waste cart, if available. Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Non-Recyclable Plastic

Not everything that is plastic is recyclable! Recycle only food & beverage bottles, jugs and tubs.

Recycle Right:

Increased costs could be in our future if we're careless about recycling

Many well-intentioned people think they are doing the right thing by recycling items they believe are recyclable, but putting the wrong things into your recycling bin can contaminate and potentially ruin the value of good recyclables. Common examples of items that can destroy the value of a household recycling load include wiring, hoses, plastic bags, and pizza boxes, etc.

The global market has shifted for recyclables and a big part of the problem is the increased cost of processing contaminated recyclables. Municipalities, businesses, and private haulers are often forced to pay contamination fees to processing facilities, and these costs are eventually passed on to residents. To offset price increases in recycling, municipalities nationwide have begun increasing education, issuing citations, charging fees, and/or instructing recycling collectors to not accept contaminated recycling bins until the contamination is removed.

Recycling is alive and well despite contamination problems in most parts of the country. It is still cost effective to recycle. Better and more efficient technologies and processing facilities are coming, but consumers MUST do a better job overall. So please, recycle right by placing only acceptable items in your recycling cart and help us keep our prices low!

NEW RECYCLING CENTER HOURS!

In response to numerous requests, effective May 1st the Recycling Center will now be open:

- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm
- Saturdays from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm
- Sundays from 12:00 noon to 4:00 pm.

The center is open year round, closed on major holidays, and located at 3600 Hartley Avenue, Palmer.

2019 Special Curbside Collections

Place items curbside for pick-up on your regularly scheduled collection day; item will be collected that week by a separate vehicle.

Yard Waste Collections: Weeks of June 3 and November 4

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, garden clippings). Place your yard waste in any open top container (your old green, round recycling container or a clean trash



container (NOT YOUR AUTOMATED CART), and/or tie with cotton or hemp twine in bundles no larger than 3' x 3' x 3', and weighing no more than 40lbs, or place in compostable paper bags (NO PLASTIC BAGS, ROPE OR TWINE). No grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo.

Metal/White Goods Collections: Week of September 30

Appliances such as air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators and freezers (remove doors and all Freon must be removed professionally and tagged with certification of removal prior to being placed at curb); washers, dryers, steel or aluminum tire rims (w/o tires), hot water heaters, bicycles, BBQ grills, and walk-behind lawnmowers (oil, gas, and propane removed). No electronics or dishwashers (most no longer made of metal). Metal and white goods can be taken year round to the Palmer Township Recycling Center, 3600 Hartley Avenue.

Bulk Item Collections:

Weeks of May 13, September 16, and December 2

Each residence is allowed to put out one (1) bulk item during each of these collection weeks. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the waste cart; with the general rule of thumb being an item the approximate dimensions and weight of a standard size sofa that can be carried by two (2) men. Acceptable items include dishwashers, furniture, mattresses, rolled up and tied rugs no larger than 3' x 6'. No electronics, construction materials, hazardous waste, tires, yard waste, grass clippings, or additional household trash.

If you can't wait for a bulk item collection, you may request a special bulk item pickup by contacting Waste Management Customer Service at 800-621-2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA to receive the Township's \$25 per item pickup price. Be sure to get the confirmation number in the event follow-up is needed.

Special Volume Collection

This collection is available for large amounts of household trash only and must be bagged or in cans (not to exceed 32-gallon size or 40 lb. weight limit). No bulk items. Residents must schedule and pay in advance by contacting Waste Management 800-621-2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA in order to receive the price of \$25 per collection. Be sure to get the confirmation number in the event follow-up is needed.

PART-TIME RECYCLING CENTER ATTENDANT NEEDED

Palmer Township is looking for an attendant willing to work outside, capable of light lifting, and enjoys interaction with the public. Responsibilities will include providing recycling education, monitoring containers, opening and closing the center, maintaining minimal records, and operating the cardboard compactor. Helping Our Community

The BIP held their January 23, Business Luncheon at the Marblehead Chowder House and as in the past, the first meeting of the year included the State of the Township. Interim Township Manager, Brenda DeGerolamo, stated the 2019 budget was adopted by the Board of Supervisors on December 10, 2018, with the goal to continue to provide high-quality municipal services to our residents and businesses. She



reviewed the 14 different funds that are included in the township budget noting they total \$33.5 million. She also noted the Board was able to present a no tax increase budget with the millage rate remaining at 8.25 mills. DeGerolamo continued with updates on activities going on within each department in the township.

Police Chief Lawrence Palmer handed out information to those in attendance and reviewed the data related to uniform crime statistics for 2018. Palmer noted theft crimes remain high principally because of the thefts from cars in the township. He urged residents to keep their vehicles locked and to keep valuables out of sight. Chief Palmer also report the department is in the process of creating a crime watch program that will use social medial to make residents more aware of what is going on and will include preventative measures.

Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Dave Colver, then reviewed projects that are taking place in the township, as listed below:

- The Fire Department is planning the development of a fire training facility in the vicinity of the police training area near Riverview Park.
- The construction of an apartment complex on Hartley Avenue will begin in 2019.
- The remaining site work at the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township will be completed this year.

The Tuskes development on both sides of Northwood Avenue will be continuing through the year. Northwood Ave. will be closed this year to complete the improvements which were started in 2018.

- Major development has taken place in the northern section of the township throughout this past year and will continue in 2019.
- An increase in tax revenue for the township, school district and county will come from these projects beginning this year and continuing into the future.

The township's Comprehensive Plan update was completed in 2018 with consulting assistance from Environmental Planning and Design. The township is currently updating its Zoning Ordinance with the help of the same consulting firm which should be completed by the end of 2019.



The weather is finally warming up and spring daffodils are showing their green leaves proudly. Generally, daffodils flower most of the month of April here in Palmer. David Carr, president of the Palmer Township Beautification project gives his advice on beautifying your outside space. "A beautiful plant is the Hibiscus and my thought is to dig out some of my hibiscus plants as one would dig out a sizable tree with a root ball. I did this procedure early last fall and friends successfully transplanted it in their yard in western Pennsylvania. My hibiscus plants were grown from seed. Some of the seeds that I harvested from my plants for the past two years are sitting in my basement now. There are several pounds of these seeds. Some will be cast into the compost at Fairview Park. If I continue to harvest the seeds each year, one can only guess who will want to share in this bounty and plant them where they desire. I always give my seeds and plants away for free. Advice is also given away. Some plants have also been delivered and planted in new friend's gardens."

The focus of the Palmer Township Beautification Project has been to build and maintain the bike path garden at Fairview Park and the two gardens at the chain link fences along Greenwood Avenue at the Palmer Post office. The Fairview Park garden is 250 yards long on the north side of the macadam bike

path. There has been a lot of work invested at both sites by Palmer Township. They cleared brush and poor soil and added composted leaf mulch for a growing medium. Palmer's efforts have made these areas beautiful with flowering plants all donated by Palmer residents and the Netherlands Bulb Company. Over several years, the Netherland's Bulb Company donated 900 pounds of mostly daffodil bulbs. The 900 pounds is not a typo! What would be appreciated? A little volunteer time would help significantly. Weeds always grow. Plants need water and droughts do happen. Adopting a plant or a few is not unheard of. This would be easy at the Post Office gardens. Just be careful of the cars that speed by. Giving them a drink when passing by would add to the beauty of our part of the world. Temporary Pools

All temporary pools <u>capable</u> of holding more than 24 inches of water <u>DO</u> require a permit and inspection each year the pool is erected. The permit must be obtained before installation occurs. Use of the pool shall be prohibited until an inspection is obtained and approval has been issued by the Building Department.

Please be aware that pools with heights between 24 inches and 48 inches will require a permanent barrier in accordance with the 2009 International Residential Code. Also, overhead power lines, grade slopes and zoning setbacks will have an impact as to the allowable location of a pool. Call the Building Code Department with any questions at 610-253-7191.





Grass/Noxious Vegetation and Sidewalk Clearance

Spring is finally here and it is time to put down that snow shovel and startup the lawn mower! Palmer's ordinances limit the height of grass and noxious vegetation to a maximum of 6-inches.

Also, please maintain the sidewalk clear of impeding tree branches, bushes and decorative vegetation by cutting such back so that the full width of the sidewalk, to a height of 7-feet, is accessible for the safety of pedestrians.

As we approach the summer season, the staff at Palmer Township Fire would like our residence to keep safety on their minds when enjoying the outdoors.

Grilling Safety

Propane and charcoal BBQ grills must only be used outdoors. If used indoors, or in any enclosed spaces such as tents, they pose both a fire hazard and the risk of exposing occupants to toxic gases and potential asphyxiation.

Position the grill well away from siding, deck railing, and out from under leaves and



overhanging branches. Many folks are surprised at how fast vinyl siding can melt from a hot grill that is too close.

Periodically remove grease or fat buildup in trays below the grill so it cannot be ignited by a hot grill. If you are using a gas grill and the flame goes out, turn the grill and the gas off, then wait at least five minutes to re-light. LP Gas is heavier than air, so it can quickly collect in the bottom of a grill. When using charcoal grills, purchase the proper starter fluid and store out of reach of children and away from heat sources. Never add charcoal starter fluid when coals or kindling have already been ignited, and never use any flammable or combustible liquid other than charcoal starter fluid to get the fire going.

When using gas grills, check the propane cylinder hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. A light soap and water solution applied to the hose will reveal escaping propane quickly by releasing bubbles. You can determine if your grill has a leak by smell, the soapy bubble test and if there is no flame.

Outdoor Burning

Palmer Township has strict ordinances relating to outdoor burning. When enjoying your patios and decks with a fire, Palmer Township only allows burning in a chimenea that is constructed with a flue. Any type of open burning, both camp fires and yard waste is strictly prohibited and enforced.



Pennsylvania Fireworks Laws

Although certain laws were lifted in Pennsylvania in regards to fireworks, they still pose an injury and fire hazard. The following laws remain in effect in Pennsylvania:

- Buyers must be over 18 to purchase fireworks.
- Fireworks can't be discharged from or toward a building or vehicle.
- Fireworks users must have permission from the owner of the property where the fireworks are to be discharged.
- Fireworks can't be used within 150 feet of an occupied building.
- Fireworks can't be used by someone under the influence of alcohol, drugs or controlled substances.



The CRIMEWATCH Network is a platform that creates transparency in local law enforcement and gives our community members instant access to information that impacts their safety. Now that our department is live with CRIMEWATCH, members of our community can sign up to receive free alerts about crime where they live. This means that if someone in your neighborhood gets arrested for a serious crime, you receive an alert right on your smartphone, and the alerts are not just text, they include the picture of the offender (when available) and the details about the arrest.

One of our intentions in signing up with CRIMEWATCH is to use the platform as a media release hub, pushing information out to our other social media and news media outlets. The Palmer Township Police Department intends to use the CRIMEWATCH Network to keep our citizens informed, connect with our community, and allow for feedback regarding the services we provide to our community.






Brief Class Descriptions:


