Bleeding Heart Plant Seeds Still Available

In a recent Palmer Newsletter, I wrote that Bleeding Heart Plant seeds should be planted in November because they need three months of cold weather to germinate in the spring. Seven residents obtained seeds from me. Many more seeds are available. I have seeds that grow pink and white flowers. As time passed, it came to me that if I keep the seeds out on my screened porch for the winter, people would still be able to plant them in the spring. The 2020 growing season was the best for me. Some of my butterfly bushes approached ten feet tall. Calla lily seeds were planted in planters in early June 2020 and 700 bulbs were harvested in November. They are now resting in my basement, safe from the winter cold. They will be planted around the last week of May hopefully in many Palmer gardens and one foot of compost from the Berks Street facility. They will stay there forever in your garden. Some of my bulbs have been in the ground for six years. One Hundred and Fifteen Calla Lily seed pods were harvested in October. The Fairview Park and Post Office gardens had daffodil and gladiola bulbs planted this fall. Volunteers and community service hours are welcome. Dave Carr, chairperson, d.carr@rcn.com 610.704.5868

The cost of our annual subscription is \$35 for an individual or \$55.00 for a family covering everyone residing in your household.

A benefit from subscribing is that your subscription fee is applied to cover any applicable coinsurance/deductibles up to \$500 per emergency ambulance trip that you would otherwise have to pay if you are not a subscriber. This is not an insurance policy. We also offer reduced rates for medically necessary non-emergency transportation services for both wheelchair and ambulance that are not covered by insurance.




A little effort goes a long way toward ensuring that your community remains a destination for local and national businesses, a growing and thriving residential community with many exceptional recreational opportunities.

WHEN YOU'RE WASHING YOUR CAR IN THE DRIVEWAY, REMEMBER YOU'RE NOT JUST WASHING YOUR CAR IN THE DRIVEWAY.



All the soap, scum, and oily grit runs along the curb. Then into the storm drain and directly into our lakes, streams and into coastal waters including the Chesapeake Bay. And that causes pollution which is unhealthy for fish. So how do you avoid this whole mess? Easy. Wash your car on grass or gravel instead of the street. Or better yet, take it to a car wash where the water gets treated and recycled.

It is the Parks & Recreation Department's goal to provide citizens with a safe environment in which recreational opportunity can be maximized. Due to the wide variety of patron needs and use of Township property, it is necessary to establish the following rules and regulations.

Event representative must have permit with them for duration of the event.

Reservations: Park Rentals are available from May 1st to November 1st. Permit applications will be available the first business day of January at 9:00am for Palmer Residents and then will become available to the general public on the first business day of February at 9:00am. All reservations must be completed in person at the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township, located at 4100 Green Pond Road Palmer, PA 18045, Phone: 610-252-2098

Fees:

- Penn Pump There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm
 - **1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit** **Not to exceed 150 people.* Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access.




Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00

2. Penn Pump Picnic Permit *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people.

Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion.

Palmer Residents \$50 & Non-Residents \$100

- Riverview Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8AM–10:00PM Palmer Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- BIP Pavilion, Briarcliffe, Fairview, Keystone, & Mill Race Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8AM 10PM Palmer Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00 *Briarcliffe is unavailable for rent on weekends from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

When is a Permit Required?

The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, as well as, the ordinances of Palmer Township require permits for many types of projects. Activities requiring permits include:



- Any structural change/alteration
- Plumbing
- Electrical
- Mechanical/HVAC (new and replacement)
- Water heaters (new and replacement)
- Reroofing
- · Replacement windows
- Decks
- Pools (permanent and temporary)

- Finished basements
- Driveways (replacement, expansion and resurface)
- Signs (except political signs) and banners
- Additional living space conversions
- Patios and patio roofs
- Fences (temporary and permanent)
- · Retaining walls
- Sheds and carports (accessory structures)
- Pavilions/Gazebos

Building code regulations require minimum standards for design and construction to ensure the safety and welfare of the occupants. The above list may not include all necessary permits. You may contact the Permit Department at (610) 253-7191 for more information.

Why Should I Cut and Leave My Grass Clippings?

- Clippings left on the lawn, shelter and help retain water, therefore requiring less watering. As the clippings decompose, they act as a natural organic fertilizer, reducing the amount of fertilizer you need to purchase and apply.
- A typical 1/2-acre lawn in Pennsylvania produces more than three tons--nearly 260 bags--of grass clippings each year and moving these bags can hurt your back! Grass clippings can represent from 20 to 50 percent of the solid waste going into landfills in the spring and summer and dramatically increases the trash hauling cost for township residents.
- Years of research have shown that by mowing frequently (5-6 times per month) and not bagging grass clippings, homeowners can save up to 40% of the time they spend on routine lawn care!

Simple steps for Grasscycling

- \bullet Cut only the top 1/3 of the grass blade and LEAVE the clippings right on the lawn
- Keep your mower blade sharp and mow when the grass is dry to avoid tracking and clumping
- If the grass gets too high, mow over the clippings a second time to further shred and scatter them.
- To prevent excess growth between mowings, raise the mower height, mow, then gradually lower it over a span of several mowings. This will help prevent shock to the plants.
- Thatch, a matted layer of dead roots and stems, usually is caused by too much water and fertilizer. Clippings don't produce thatch because they are 80 percent water and decompose quickly.
- No special equipment is necessary. While mulching mowers are available and do a great job, any conventional mower can grasscycle just remove the collection bag! In the case of rear discharge mowers, the exhaust chute must be shut off.
- Mulching blades, adapter kits or retrofit kits are now readily available for your conventional mowers.
- By not trashing grass, you can reduce your mowing time by nearly 40 percent and spend less money on fertilizer and trash bags. And you'll be doing your part for the environment by reducing waste.





A contact tracer from your state health department might call if you've been exposed to COVID-19. But scammers are pretending to be contact tracers, too. Here's how you can spot the scam.



Real contact tracers won't ask you for money.

Only scammers insist on payment by gift card, money transfer, or cryptocurrency.



Contact tracing doesn't require your bank account or credit card number.

Never share account information with anybody who contacts you asking for it.



Legitimate contact tracers will never ask for your Social Security number.

Never give any part of your Social Security number to anyone who contacts you.



Your immigration status doesn't matter for contact tracing, so real tracers won't ask.

If they do, you can bet it's a scam.



Do not click on a link in a text or email.

Doing so can download malware onto your device.

Talking to a real contact tracer helps stop the spread of COVID-19. Reporting scammers helps stop them, too. Report fake contact tracers to your state and at **ftc.gov/complaint**.
