MS4 Best Management Practices (BMP) - Native Plants

Long before humans roamed the earth and started altering the environment, plants thrived in open space. Over time plants adapted to their surroundings, finding the best way to live with the other organisms in the area. Some examples of plant adaptation are cacti in the desert that have waxy coatings on their leaves to retain water (Plant Adaptations, 2022). When plants have evolved to be best suited to their environment, these are called native plants. Another definition would be a plant that existed in an area before colonization of Europeans (Landscaping with Native Plants, 2022). The opposite of a native plant would be an invasive



plant, which is a plant from another environment that is introduced to an area where there are no natural predators. Native plants are important not only to Pennsylvania, but to all areas of the world because the plants are best suited to live there, but also because the animals rely on those native plants for their food source. Native plants attract pollinators like bees, moths, hummingbirds, and beetles to continue the plant population into the next year (Landscaping with Native Plants, 2022). The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DNCR) tracks and promotes plantings that will aid native pollinators (Landscaping with Native Plants, 2022).



When you plant native you should keep in mind to conserve existing native vegetation and plant communities; why dig up the native plants that are already there? Choose nursery propagated native plants to ensure that the species is native and not just labeled as a native plant (Landscaping with Native Plants, 2022). Keeping native plants in their habitat is

the goal, so please do not remove any native plants from the wild to be transplanted in your own yard. Limit fertilizer and chemical usage to increase plant health and never plant an invasive species. The most important tip is to know your site! Is there wet or dry soil? Is it a sunny or shady spot most of the day? The site conditions truly determine what type or species of plant you should be choosing. Pennsylvania has a wide variety of native plants suited to every type of condition, you are guaranteed to find a native plant that will suit your garden or landscaping site! Do your part for the environment and choose native plants this spring! 

PLANNING



By completing these courses Jeff has achieved the recognition of Certified Urban Planner. These courses are prepared and implemented by the Pennsylvania Municipal Education Institute (PMPEI) and offer a comprehensive understanding of the principals of municipal planning and development. Jeff has also achieved an "Outstanding Award" from the PMPEI. The George Fasic Outstanding Planning Education Achievement Award is provided to recognize officials demonstrating a commitment to planning education by completing all four of PMPEI's core courses: Community Planning, Subdivision and Land Development Review, Zoning, and Zoning Administration.

Bob Blanchfield, Planning Commission Chairman added "I believe it is fantastic when Planning Commission members seek additional education in order to become better Commission members. Thank you, Jeff, for your efforts in this continuing education process."

Jeff has been a member of the Planning Commission since 2015. He is a board member of the Businesses, Industrial and Professional Association (BIP) in Palmer Township. He is the founder and coordinator of the Palmer 5K race that raises money which has been donated to the Miracle League of Northampton County. Jeff and his business "And the Sign Says" are very active in the Palmer Community. We congratulate Jeff on his accomplishment and thank him for his dedicated service to our Township Planning Commission.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

All carts should be placed curbside by 5:00am. Materials placed outside of the carts will not be collected. Lids need to be closed and not overflowing to prevent litter and cart lid breakage.



CARDBOARD – paper towel rolls, cereal, cracker, and pasta boxes, shipping and shoe boxes, manila folders, etc. No wax-coated, pizza or other food, paint or oil contaminated boxes. Flatten and/or cut up to release from the cart easily.

PLASTIC BOTTLES OR CONTAINERS – Rinsed household tubs and bottles (such as soda, water, milk, juice, shampoo, detergent, condiments, yogurt, margarine, to-go containers, pet food, etc.) No plastic bags or Styrofoam. Look for the recycling triangle on the bottom with these numbers inside #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, #7. Lids attached.

FLEXIBLE (NOT RIGID) PLASTICS – these are <u>able to flex or wrap and are rinsed clean of food contamination.</u> Acceptable items include plastic shopping bags, potato chip and snack bags, produce bags including salad and carrot bags, shredded cheese packages, pet treat pouches, case wrap, shrink film, bread bags, bubble wrap, cereal bags, drink pouches, paper towel and toilet paper overwraps, detergent pouches, shipping bags.

GLASS - Rinsed clear, brown, and green bottles and jars. Discard lids.

CANS – Rinsed aluminum, bi-metal, and tin cans as well as empty aerosol cans.

METAL POTS AND PANS

CARTONS – Rinsed food cartons that contain milk, juice, broth, cream, egg substitutes, soup, soy milk, and wine boxes.

No food contaminated items, electronics, textiles, construction debris, or yard waste.

2023 HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS

Waste and recycling collections will be delayed by one day following these holidays: Memorial Day, the Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

CURBSIDE TRASH

- All trash goes into your green cart with the green lid. Materials outside the cart will not be collected.
- Trash should be bagged before being placed in the cart. Bagging helps keep your cart clean and reduces windblown litter.
- <u>Prohibited items include recyclables</u> (see left), tires, hazardous waste, liquid paint, motor oil, electronics, yard waste, construction debris (wood, concrete, window panes, etc.), dirt, rock, and car parts.
- Overfilled carts or carts containing prohibited items will not be collected.

RECYCLING DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Open to Palmer Residents & Businesses Only

Hartley Avenue Recycling Center

Monday, Wednesday, Friday, 8:00am–4:00pm Saturday, 10:00am-3:00pm Sunday, 12:00pm-4:00pm

Accepts paper, cardboard, plastic bottles and containers, glass, cans, scrap metals, and yard waste (no more than 3 small bundles of yard waste (no larger than 3' x 3' and not exceeding 40 lbs.) per visit. Free to Palmer residents and businesses.

Berks Street Yard Waste Composting Center

Berks Yard Waste Center will be open the first Sunday of the month in December, January and February.

Accepts large amounts of yard waste for a small fee. NO plastic rope, bags, or twine; grass clippings, tree stumps, soil or dirt, sod, wood, animal excrement, or noxious weeds including bamboo of any kind. Tree limbs must be less than 12" inches in diameter.

Speed limit within the center is 5 MPH at all times.

UPCOMING SPECIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS

Place curbside on your scheduled collection day, but will be collected that week by a separate vehicle.

BULK ITEM COLLECTION: Weeks of March 6, May 8, September 11, & November 27

One item per collection. Bulk items are defined as items too large to fit into the trash cart; with the general rule of thumb being an item the approximate dimensions and weight of a standard size sofa, and that can be carried by two (2) men. Acceptable items include plastic dishwashers, furniture, mattresses and box springs (wrapped in plastic), rugs rolled up and tied and no larger than 3' x 6'. Unacceptable items include, but are not limited to, electronics, construction debris (i.e. wood, sinks, toilets, doors, windows, siding, roofing shingles, etc.), large glass items (i.e. glass tables, china cabinets, or window panes), hazardous materials, tires, yard waste, grass clippings, or additional household trash. If you can't wait for a bulk item collection, you may request a special bulk item collection by contacting Waste Management Customer Service at 800.621.2100. Identify yourself as a resident of Palmer Township, PA to receive the Township's \$40 per item pickup price. Be sure to get the confirmation number in the event follow-up is needed.

METAL AND APPLIANCES COLLECTION: Weeks of April 10 and September 25

One item per collection. Appliances such as microwaves, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators and freezers (remove doors; FREON does not need to be removed); washers, dryers, metal dishwashers, steel or aluminum tire rims (w/o tires), hot water heaters, metal swing sets (taken apart and tied up), bicycles, BBQ grills (gas, propane, and/or charcoal removed), and push-behind lawnmowers (oil and gas removed). No electronics or plastic dishwashers. Metal items and appliances, as described here, can be taken to the Palmer Township Recycling Center, 3600 Hartley Avenue, year-round.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION: June 5 and November 6

Unlimited amounts of yard waste (leaves, branches, twigs, flowers, roots, bushes, and garden clippings) will be collected curbside. Tree limbs must be less than 4" inches in diameter. NO plastic rope, bags, or twine, grass clippings, tree stumps, loose soils, sod, or any wood or tree limbs over four (4) inches in diameter, animal excrement, noxious weeds, or bamboo of any kind or soil.

LEAF COLLECTION: Eight weeks in the Fall (typically mid-October to second week of December)

Residents must rake their leaves into the street and close to the curb. This collection is highly dependent on weather conditions.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION - First three (3) full weeks in January

Remove any transport bags, tinsel, ornaments, lights, and tree stands.

It is the Parks & Recreation Department's goal to provide citizens with a safe environment in which recreational opportunity can be maximized. Due to the wide variety of patron needs and use of Township property, it is necessary to establish the following rules and regulations.

EVENT REPRESENTATIVE MUST HAVE PERMIT WITH THEM FOR DURATION OF THE EVENT.

Reservations: Will be available to Palmer residents only for the month of January, beginning on January 4th, 2023 at 9:00am. Park rentals will become available to the general public on February 1st, 2023 at 9:00am. All reservations must be completed in person at the Charles Chrin Community Center of Palmer Township, located at 4100 Green Pond Road Palmer, PA 18045, Phone: 610-252-2098




*Pavilion rentals are prohibited during Palmer Community Weekend.

FEES:

- **PENN PUMP:** There are 2 permits available per day at Penn Pump Park. Penn Pump permits allow the consumption of alcohol and access to restrooms. Rental time 8:00am–10:00pm
 - 1. Penn Pump Pavilion Permit *Not to exceed 150 people. Allows parking near the pavilion and pavilion access. **Residents \$100.00**
 - 2. Penn Pump Picnic Permit *Not to exceed 50 people, required for 10 or more people. Picnic permit for Penn Pump allows access to tables outside of the pavilion. **Residents \$50.00**
- RIVERVIEW: Permit for Riverview Park allows the responsible use of alcohol. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm.
 Residents \$100.00 & Non-Residents \$175.00
- **BIP PAVILION, BRIARCLIFFE, FAIRVIEW, KEYSTONE, & MILL RACE** Alcohol prohibited. Rental time 8:00am-10:00pm

Residents \$75.00 & Non-Residents \$150.00

EARTH STEWARDS OF PALMER TOWNSHIP

This article is the third in a 4-part series on the Palmer Township Watershed. As was explained in two previous articles, a watershed is a geographic area cut by rivers, streams and creeks that also encompass the outlying areas that drain into these waterways. The two waterway components directly affecting Palmer Township are the Bushkill Creek and Lehigh River. This article will concentrate on the Biology (animals & plants) and the Ecology (interactions of animals & plants) in the natural environment of this watershed.

As was printed in article two of this series, there are over 246 species of birds that have been recorded frequenting just the Bushkill Creek section of our watershed. There are many other inhabitants in the reptile, amphibian and mammal groups that abound in our watershed as well. Toads, Bull, Green or Pickerel Frogs, Red-backed Salamanders, Box, Mud, Painted and Red-eared Slider Turtles are frequently on the water's edge, under rocks or sun-basking on large dead trees that emerge from the water's surface.

A not so comfortable story is that of the Red-eared Slider Turtle (non-native to this area) which was accidentally introduced many years ago. It survived and bred so successfully, it is now classified as invasive. The Slider has unfortunately out-competed other species of turtles, especially the smaller and native Painted Turtle. These Sliders were sold in area pet stores as the half-dollar sized green turtles many of us older residents remember. They either escaped their owner's property or were purposefully released because the owners chose not to care for them anymore.

Garter, Milk and Common Water Snakes are more secretive than most of the amphibians but are sometimes encountered sun basking on our waterside bike paths. White-tailed Deer, Gray Squirrels, Chipmunks, both Gray & Red Fox, Rabbits and Muskrats are the most common mammals you may experience during the daylight hours.

There are copious varieties of plant species that inhabit Palmer's Watershed. While a separate article would be needed to describe these species in depth, there are a few facts regarding plant life that are essential in regard to the health of a watershed. Trees, shrubs, grasses, and even large weeds, that cover the waterway banks and ground areas of a watershed absolutely need to be preserved to prevent soil erosion. When vegetation is removed, soil adjacent to moving bodies of water gets washed downstream. When this erosion process starts it is self-perpetuating and gets worse with time. Significant erosion is capable of altering the course of a river or creek causing flash flooding and resultant damage to the properties along the waterways.









Please respect the habitats of the flora & fauna living in the watershed, not only for the enjoyment of the hikers, walkers, and bikers, but also for the preservation of the living organisms themselves. Removing vegetation or causing the demise of these natural inhabitants upsets the eco-system, which can result in a spiral of destruction we should want to prevent. Pollution of all sorts has an impact that may proceed unnoticed until the organisms begin to suffer. The pictures at left illustrate examples of direct effects of carelessness.

Litter & chemical pollution from our negligence is carried downstream and eventually becomes concentrated in the oceans. We do have the ability to control these issues. In the early 1900's, over fishing and cities dumping sewage directly into the Delaware River resulted in the decimation of the Shad fish population. Measures were instituted to rectify the problem to where some fishermen claim that in 2018 they witnessed the best Shad run they had ever seen.

Please consider these points in your daily activities. By respecting and preserving the watershed we live in, we will help ensure that we, and future generations of Palmer residents, have pristine areas to continually enjoy.

Clearance of Snow from Public Sidewalks



Please remember that all snow, ice or sleet shall be removed from all public sidewalks abutting your property within 12 hours after the same has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon. This includes the accessibility ramps located at street intersections.

Whenever it may be impossible to remove all snow, sleet or ice, which may have become compacted by travel or formed on sidewalks so as to present a slippery surface, ashes, cinders, sand or any other suitable substance shall be applied as to facilitate safe walking upon the sidewalks.

Palmer Township has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the depositing of snow by property owners, residents and any person(s) onto the surface of any roadway, street, highway and other areas within the township. There have been times throughout the winter season when snow has been thrown onto the roadway after

plowing has been completed and thaws and refreezes as day and night temperatures fluctuate, thereby causing hazardous areas on the roadway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, snowplowing, snow blowing, shoveling and dumping of any snow, ice or other frozen precipitation onto the roadway and other areas of the township.

§109-3(SS) - Depositing snow prohibited: No person shall throw, blow, shovel, plow, push, dump or by any other manner, deposit any snow, ice, slush or other form of frozen precipitation upon any state highway, township road, median, roadside shoulder and swale, intersection sight triangle, inlet, public sidewalk, fire hydrant or privately owned property without the permission from the property owner. Exempted from these restrictions are state and municipal employees and other individuals contracted by said state or municipal governmental authorities expressly for the purpose of snow and ice removal and/or plowing.


