

The Permits can range from a simple installation of a small shed or Accessory Structure to Decks and Patios, additions to homes, installations of Swimming Pools, HVAC installation or replacement, new home construction, up to the largest of buildings in the Township. Please, do not hesitate to call the Permit Desk with any questions about project work and the need for a Permit Application. Here In the Municipal Building, there is a Team of professionals with a wealth of knowledge about Palmer Township Codes and Zoning.

Jim Raudenbush

Jim Raudenbush was hired as a code enforcement officer/building inspector with Palmer township 21+ years ago and currently serves as the Zoning Administrator. As the Zoning Administrator he is responsible to examine, record and file all applications for zoning permits, with any accompanying plans and documents, and to issue such permits only for lots, uses and structures which are in conformity with the zoning ordinance, initiate enforcement proceedings and conduct inspections of property for which zoning permits have been issued to ascertain if the construction or use is in conformity with the provisions of the permit. He also reviews and coordinates applications that go before the township Zoning Hearing Board and attends the meetings on the township's behalf. As the Building Code Official, he is responsible for the administration of the overall code enforcement program of the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code and oversees the township third party inspection agencies.



Jim attended the Pennsylvania School of Technology and holds multiple International Code Council Certifications to conduct inspections as required by the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code. Outside of work Jim enjoys golf, hiking, camping, snowmobiling, attending concerts and taking his dog Oliver on walks.

Announcing New Tree Ordinance

On Monday April 1, the Board of Supervisors enacted a new ordinance related to the maintenance, removal, and replacement of public shade and street trees.

The goal is to promote the maintenance and replanting of public trees in Palmer Township, which provide shade, beauty, and numerous environmental benefits to all.

The ordinance outlines property owners' responsibilities for trees which exist in the public right-of-way including vine removal, pruning and sight clearance. Additionally, a permit is now required before removing any public tree.

TO FLUSH OR NOT TO FLUSH: WHAT DO I DO WITH EXPIRED OR UNWANTED MEDICINES?

There's a good chance you have expired or unwanted medicine in your home. When you are ready to clean out the cabinet, where does the medicine go?



Many are surprised to learn that there is a

designated disposal method and putting medicine down the drain or flushing it in the toilet is not the answer! Pharmaceuticals that are poured down the drain or flushed can pollute our waterways, hurt our fish and wildlife, and can end up in our drinking water. How? Wastewater treatment plants are not designed to treat pharmaceuticals. The contents of medicines, which include hormones, antidepressants, endocrine disrupting compounds, and a mirage of other chemicals, simply pass through the wastewater process back out into the streams, which are commonly used as a drinking water source. In our streams and waterways, pharmaceuticals can impact fish and wildlife by interfering with their reproduction and normal growth.

Now that you know why the drain and sewer are not the answer, where do you go with that medicine? Palmer Township has a plan for you!

The Palmer Township Police Department has a medicine disposal collection box in the lobby. The hours of lobby operation are Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5 pm, and Saturdays, 8 am to 4 pm. The Palmer Township Police Department is located at 5 Weller Place, Easton, PA 18045. You can also reach them at (610) 253-5844.



The Palmer Township medicine disposal collection box accepts the following:

- Tablets and capsules (punched out from their tin or foil casing and loose out of the bottle)
- Vitamins and pet medicines
- Pills that are loose in a sealed or zipped storage bag

Palmer Township does not accept:

- Intravenous solutions
- Injectables or syringes
- Liquids
- Hydrogen peroxide
- Compressed cylinders or aerosols (asthma inhalers)
- Iodine-containing medications
- Thermometers
- Alcohol

For the disposal of liquid medicines, eye drops, ear drops, and nose sprays:

Mix the expired/unwanted medicine with a material like coffee grounds or kitty litter. Place the mixture in a sealable bag or container. Throw the container/bag in the trash (contact your local hauler with questions on disposal options/requirements)

YOU MAY HAVE MONEY IN THE PA TREASURY!

Did you ever wonder what happens to a lost money order, a forgotten bank account or an uncashed check? The Pennsylvania Treasury is holding more than \$4 billion in cash and other liquid assets that may belong to you.

You NEVER have to pay anyone to be reunited with your unclaimed property. My staff members are eager to help you and claiming your money is easy and free! You do not need to hire anyone to help you make your claim.

In 2023, my district offices filed 205 claims totaling \$96,695.28. Since we've provided this service, we have filed 695 claims totaling \$914,242.87 on behalf of the residents of the 137th district.

The Treasury's unclaimed property database was recently updated as is done each year. If you would like my staff to check if you have unclaimed property, we'd be happy to help. 




MS4 ARTICLE – GRASS POLLUTION

With summer in full swing, mowing season is upon us. While maintaining your lawn, it's important to remember a critical aspect of yard care: keeping grass clippings out of the street and storm drains. Grass clippings that end up in the street can cause significant environmental and safety issues. Here's why it matters and how you can help protect our local waterways.

Yard debris, including grass clippings, leaves, and shrubbery trimmings, is a major source of stormwater pollution. Unlike sanitary sewers, storm drains do not connect to treatment plants. This means that whatever enters the storm drains—whether it's rainwater or yard waste—flows directly into nearby lakes, streams, and rivers without any treatment. Grass clippings blown into the street can clog storm drains, leading to drainage issues and localized flooding. This can result in water backing up within the drainage system or the creek, causing inconvenience and potential property damage. Additionally, wet grass clippings on streets can create slippery and hazardous conditions for drivers, motorcyclists, and bicyclists, increasing the risk of accidents.

When grass clippings decompose in waterways, they release nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus. These nutrients can cause excessive algae growth, known as algae blooms, which can block sunlight and deplete oxygen levels in the water. This can lead to fish killings and

other aquatic life issues. According to the U.S. EPA, phosphorus is one of the most troublesome pollutants in stormwater runoff and is a primary cause of water quality problems in our waterways.



It is also important to mow your lawn often enough so no more than one-third of the grass height is removed. Taller grass has deeper roots, which help prevent soil erosion and retain moisture, reducing the need for frequent watering. Leaving grass clippings on the lawn can improve soil health. They decompose quickly and provide nutrients equivalent to one fertilizer application per year that can reduce the need for additional fertilizers. Another way to manage yard waste is to mix grass clippings with leaves and soil to create a compost pile. This is an excellent way to recycle yard waste and create nutrient-rich compost for your garden.

Pet waste can also be a significant pollutant. Scoop up pet waste and dispose of it in the trash, as it can contain harmful bacteria and nutrients that degrade water quality. For spills of household chemicals or fuels, use caution and a broom and dustpan or absorbent materials. Never hose spills into storm drains.

Recapping 2023

How much did Palmer recycle in 2023?

Palmer residents recycled a total of 4,619 tons curbside, and dropped off a total of 736 tons of recyclables at the recycling center!

Commercial entities in Palmer recycled a total of 6,808 tons curbside, and dropped off a total of 227 tons of recyclables at the recycling center!

This equates to a grand total of 12,390 tons of recyclables collected in Palmer in 2023!

How much money has Palmer received for its recycling efforts?

To date, Palmer Township has received a total of \$3,814,737 in grant money from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. This money is used to purchase equipment like trash and recycling toters, leaf collection machinery, and it is also used to fund the continued development of the new recycling center! A huge thank you to all the residents and businesses who continue to support and take part in Palmer's recycling program!

- Violating any local, state, or federal laws



What does "Palmer Proud" mean? Palmer Proud is the pride you have in yourself and your community, the pride you show to others reflects back upon you.

We have heard the phrase, "It takes a community to raise a child!" Well, it takes a community with pride in itself to raise itself above the average, the routine, the mundane! You moved to Palmer Township for a reason or a multitude of reason: proximity to highways, hospitals, churches, shopping, recreation, educational facilities, Township Community Center, Pool, Public Works and Parks Departments upkeep of the Township's (your) properties, being managed by a highly professional and dedicated staff. Welcome to Palmer Township, a highly diverse community. Those who were born here have chosen to remain here for those very same reasons. Those of us who moved here many years ago, did so for the very same reasons that you did!

As a resident of Palmer Township being "Palmer Proud" extends beyond simple cleanliness and maintenance of one's property, it extends to the way you interact with others within your community. While out and about, obey all traffic control devices, show respect and courtesy for and to others, for when you show respect to others they will respect you in turn. This extends to the Township's trails and parks. Be conscious and considerate of others. Don't expect others to show you more respect than that which you give them. When dealing with individuals remember, you do not know the kind of issues that they are dealing with in their daily lives. The same goes for you, having a bad day, don't When out and about, smile, force your bad day upon others! say "Hello" and hold a door for the person coming behind you, hold the door open, stand aside and let them pass ahead of you. If you see someone with a heavy package, ask if you can assist them.

Litter has become a major issue within our community. When out walking your pet, ensure that you pick up any solid waste they leave, and dispose of it in a trash container and not by throwing it into the shrubs. When out and about and you stop for a quick drive-thru meal, dispose of the bag, wrappers, drink container and straw in a trash can either at home, at the gas station, or within the many trash cans available in our Township parks, and NOT roadside! Remember, the litter barrels are there for a purpose!

When using the seventeen miles of public trails use Trail Courtesy. There is a national program "Carry out what you carry in!" That is very simple, don't leave your empty water bottle, soft drink, food/candy wrapper trail side, carry it to the next trash can. Walk to the right side of the trail. Obey the signs along the trail, especially at intersections with roadways, walk your bike across the intersection. While riding a bike, let people know that you will approach and pass on their left/right - remember, they cannot see you approaching from behind. There is ambient noise from adjacent businesses, roadways, homes and not everyone is blessed with perfect hearing, so ring a bell, say out loud that you are approaching - don't wait till you are immediately adjacent to the walker for you will scare them. Remember this courtesy is not only for the walker's safety but yours as well. Have you ever fallen off a bike at 20 MPH - so slow down when passing those on foot, be courteous and considerate and they will be appreciative of your consideration.

Many people have commented about the Impervious Surface Fee (MS4) that was recently imposed. When doing yard work, do not let the grass clippings from the lawn mower go into the street. They collect on and in the storm drain grates and system resulting in localized flooding. Same for litter, it accumulates at the storm drains. Be a great community minded resident and clear the storm drain grates in front of your property, this way the leaves, grass, weeds, and litter will not block the storm drain system resulting in flooding damage to your property and the property of your neighbors.

Over the course of the next year Palmer Township will be presenting suggestions to you as to how you can become involved in showing that you are Palmer Proud! The end result we are seeking to achieve is a community wide 2025 Earth Day cleanup and a continued effort by all residents to ensure that Palmer Township remains the desired destination for residence and recreation. These suggestions will extend from carrying a litter bag in your car to collect items to be properly disposed of once home, or while stopped at the gas station, or during your visit to one of the multitudes of Palmer Parks. Show by example and teach your children that when they are finished with a treat, candy, meal to place the waste materials in the trash cans provided. Another way of showing Palmer Pride is to assist your neighbors who may be having health or physical issues and cannot cut their lawn, ask to help them, and cut their lawn for them. Great exercise for you and a kindness shown to them.

Church groups can adopt a parishioner who is having financial or physical hardship, collectively assisting the individual or family via performing yard work, or simple exterior maintenance or even a complete makeover of the property. Within each church congregation there are a multitude of occupations, skill sets and a willingness to help one of your less fortunate congregation members.

Volunteers compose many of the Township Committees: Environmental Steering, Shade Tree, Zoning, and Planning. Business in Palmer (BIP) has assisted Palmer Township in innumerable ways, from the dog litter stations along the Township Trails, to building the new Athletic Field House at the Field of Dreams on Green Pond Road. These and other civic minded groups, too numerous to mention here, contribute in a multitude of ways keeping Palmer Township ahead of the curve in volunteer services. Palmer Township has a Volunteer Fire Department, who is always seeking new members! There are other civic minded groups such as the Earth Stewards of Palmer. You have seen them out and about with their green ball caps and yellow safety vests clearing litter from a variety of portal roadways that lead into Palmer Township. During 2023 they removed over three (03) tons of litter from our roadways and trails.

Do you want to be a Community Leader, a Trend Setter, an Example for others to follow? Showing Community Pride in all things that you do, thus showing others, by example, that you are a self-starter, a leader within your community! *If not you, then who?*

Do folks who live and work in Palmer Township have Community Pride, you bet!






